MARKET RECIPE

Classic Pumpkin Pie (Makes 6 large or 8 small pieces)

Pre-heat oven to 425°. Prepare crust. Mix together crust dry ingredients. Cut shortening into dry ingredients (your bowl should be full of small clumps, when finished). Add water 1 tablespoon at a time until mixture holds together. Use a rolling pin to roll dough out to approximately 1 1/4 times the size of your pie pan. Place dough in pan and finish edges.

Combine filling ingredients and mix until well blended. Pour filling into crust and bake at 425° for fifteen minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350° and bake for 30 to 40 minutes more or until a cake tester comes out clean. Top with whipped cream, if desired, and serve
